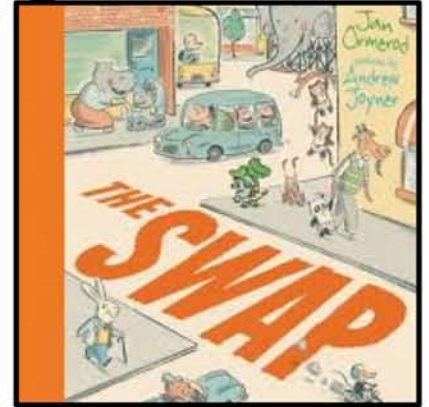


Book Week 2014 – Early Childhood

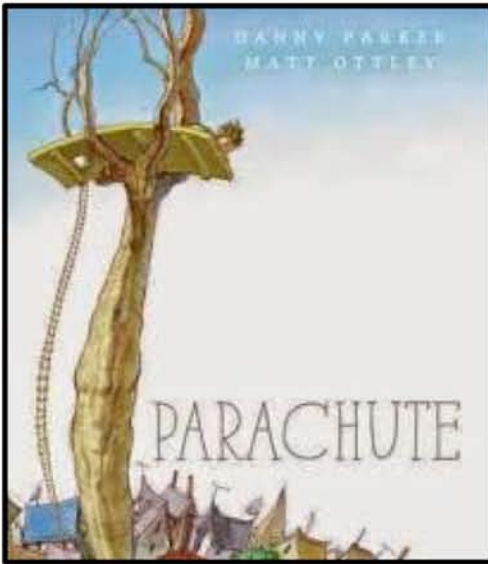
This is a story about a pig who made the sheep do lots of jobs for him. He asked them why they didn't like him and they told him that he needed to be nice. So he made them a present.

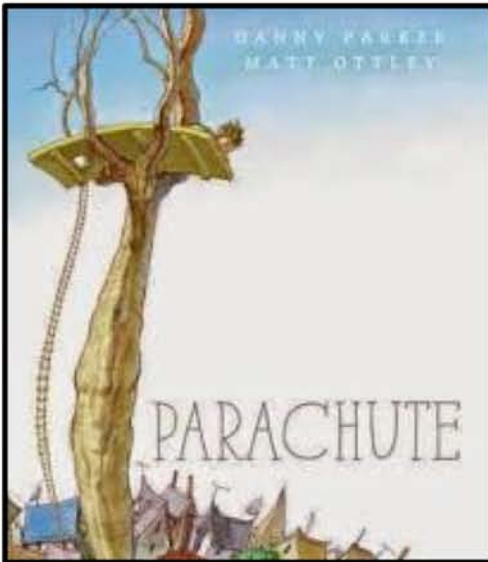
HOW TO MAKE A PARACHUTE

What you need

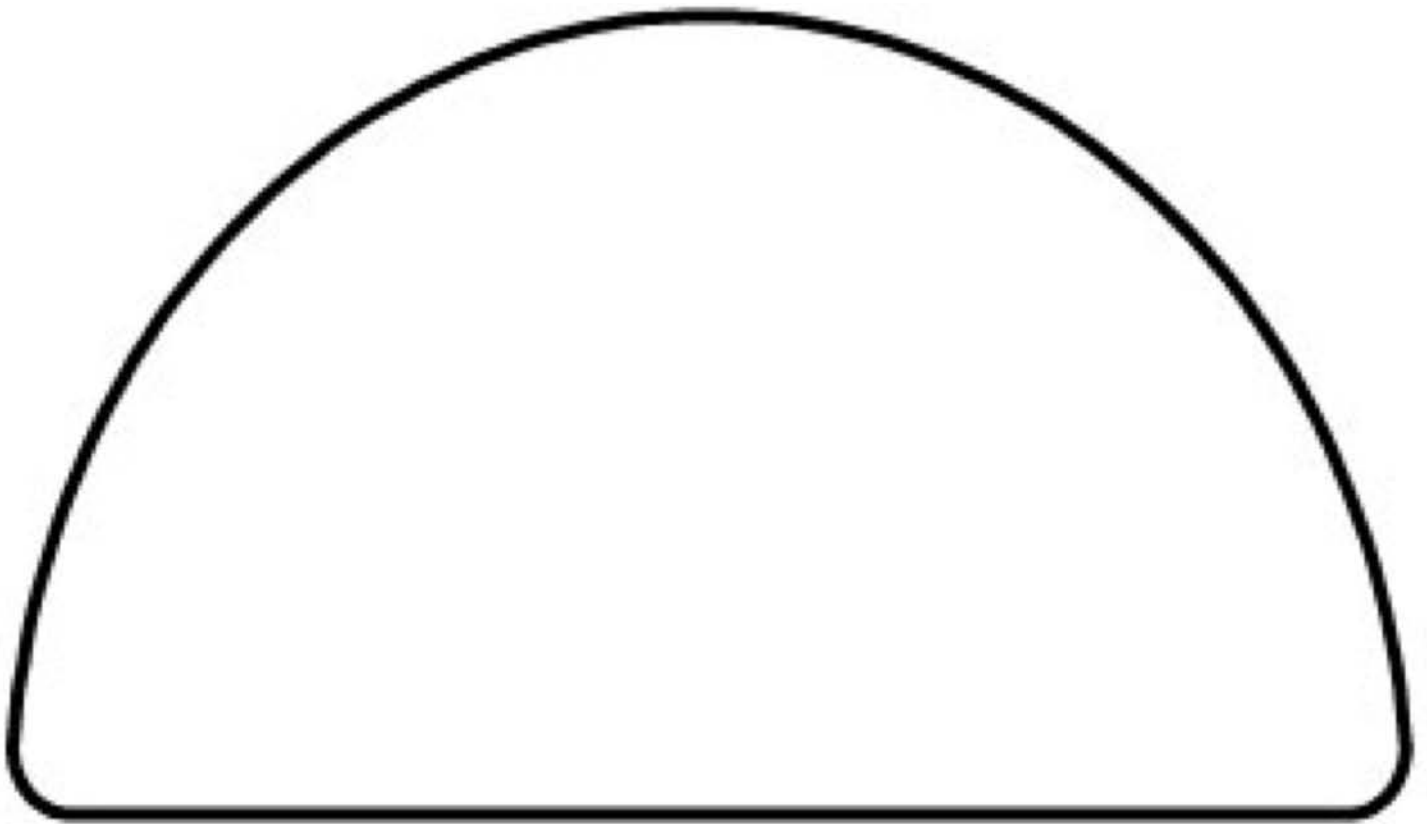
- 2 pieces of tissue paper
- 4 pieces of ribbon
- 1 piece of blu-tack
- Sticky tape

What you do

1. Put the tissue paper on top of each other and twist the ends together.
2. Sticky tape the ribbon to the tissue paper.
3. Roll the blu-tack into a blob and wind it around the ribbon
4. Test your parachute! Did it work?



HOW TO MAKE A PARACHUTE



What You Need

piece of cardboard
pencil
tissue paper
glue
2 paddle pop sticks
Blob of Blu-tack

What You Do

1. Draw a half circle shape on the cardboard.
2. Decorate it with tissue paper.
3. Tape 2 paddle pop sticks to the back.
4. Stick the end of the sticks into a blob of blu-tack.

SILVER BUTTONS ART

What You Need

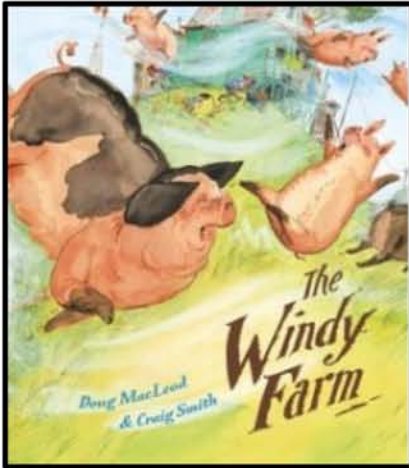
piece of cardboard, pencil, your foot, scissors, coloured pencils, textas or crayons, piece of silver foil.

What You Do

1. Put your foot onto the cardboard and trace around it.
2. Cut out the footprint shape.
3. Onto the footprint, draw a scene of something that could be happening around the world. (It could be a day time or night time picture.) Use lots of colour.
4. Cut out a small circle from the scrap piece of cardboard. Cover it in silver foil.
5. Glue your silver button onto the footprint.



MAKE A WINDMILL



What you need
Scissors, colours,
hole punch,
drawing pin, an
old pencil

What you do
1. Colour the windmill and cut along
the dotted lines.
2. Fold the edges into the middle.
3. Push the pin through the centre.
4. Attach the pin to the pencil.
5. Blow! Does your windmill work?
