


- 1. What do you think the mother is looking at?

We used to play a lot of fun games. Rounders, rolly pollys and marbles were my favourites. What games do you like to play?


After we had our supper and our bath. Nan would sit with us and tell us stories. Stories of the old people and the old times gone. Our stories are special.
