






Chinese New Year begins in January or February every year. The legend says that the Emperor organised a race for 12 animals. As each animal finished the race, he named a year after them.



Slowly, young Seamus walked home with his shovel. He didn't have his gold. He didn't have the leprechaun.


And now, he didn't even have his neckerchief.
