Term 2 focus unit - State & Federal Government

This term's research project is linked to the HSIE unit being studied in class and will involve a study of the contributions of Australia's Prime Ministers. Each student will be allocated a Prime Minister to research in order to answer the following questions:

- How long did this Prime Minister lead the country?
- To which party did they belong?
- What is a major reform or law they implemented?
- Are there any interesting facts about this Prime Minister?

Students will follow the 6 steps of the Information Skills Process and can complete their research using a program of their own choice. They will be involved in devising their own rubric for the marking of their work. Lessons will be completed as follows.
